Wanted to offer more college-level classes to high schools. One of the problems was the small number of students who qualified. Not enough students to justify hiring instructors to go to the high schools.

Solution: equip the rooms that were built into the new high schools at the time of their construction around 2000.

The county commissioners allocated special funds to the college to achieve this. In the summer of 2009 the rooms were equipped and furnished.

Due to budget constraints the legislature cut the number of classes that could be offered under the program; however, the county schools and college did not want abandon the effort so the high schools have been using the rooms for special offerings from the school of science and math. Interactive television.

For spring 2010 our first interactive television at East Bladen is underway for this semester. Currently students are enrolled in college algebra and (find out what Math 162 is) and business math.
