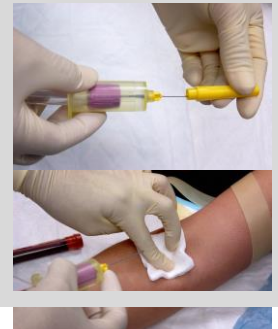

Medical Coding Part I & II

Part I: First part of a two-part online course that prepares the students to become Medical Coders. Medical Coders review medical records to determine diagnostic and procedural information that is then put into numerical codes. Insurance companies and third-party payers to determine reimbursement use these codes. Topics covered will be medical terminology, anatomy, physiology, pathophysiology, medical records, medical ethics, and an overview of ICD- 10-CM coding.

Part II: Second part of a two-part online course that prepares the students to become Medical Coders. This course will provide instruction in ICD-10-CM, CPT and using HCPCS. Using the information learned in this course will prepare students in everyday job duties of medical coding professionals.

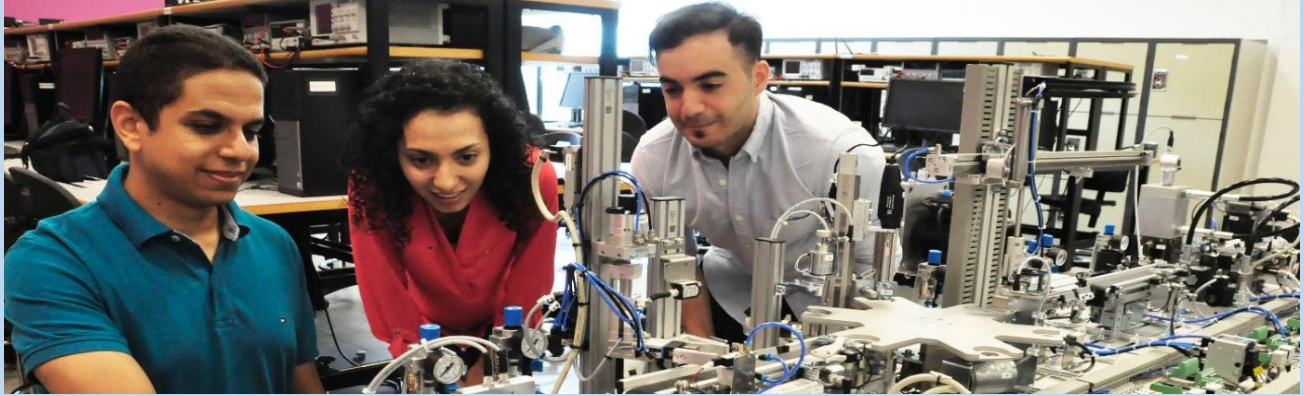

What is Mechatronics?

This course introduces the synergistic integration and application of mechanical, electrical, electronic, robotic, and computer engineering technologies, including Programmable Logic Controllers (PLC), that are found within production and manufacturing environments striving to improve and/or optimize efficiency, productivity, and quality. Upon completion, students will be able to demonstrate an understanding of the function of the components of a mechatronic system, their controlling interactions, problem solving, and the overall operation of the mechatronic control system.
